## I. General Provisions

- A. The Corporation is required to implement the prov1s10ns of New York State ("State") Executive Law Article 15-A and 5 NYCRR Parts 142-144 ("MWBE Regulations") for all State contracts as defined therein, with a value (1) in excess of \$25,000 for labor, services, equipment, materials, or any combination of the foregoing or (2) in excess of \$100,000 for real property renovations and construction.
- B. Contractor agrees, in addition to any other nondiscrimination provision of the Contract and at no additional cost to the Housing Trust Fund Corporation ("Corporation"), to fully comply and cooperate with the Corporation in the implementation of New York State Executive Law Article 15-A. These requirements include equal employment opportunities for minority group members and women ("EEO") and contracting opportunities for certified minority and women• owned business enterprises ("MWBEs"). Contractor's demonstration of "good faith efforts" pursuant to 5 NYCRR §142.8 shall be a part of these requirements. These provisions shall be deemed supplementary to, and not in lieu of, the nondiscrimination provisions required by New York State Executive Law Article 15 (the "Human Rights Law") or other applicable federal, State or local laws.
- C. Failure to comply with all of the requirements herein may result in a finding of non-responsiveness, non-responsibility and/or a breach of Contract, leading to the withholding of funds or such other actions, liquidated damages pursuant to section VII of this Appendix II or enforcement proceedings as allowed by the Contract.

## II. Contract Goals

- A. For purposes of this procurement, the Corporation hereby establishes an overall goal of 30% for Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises ("MWBE") participation, 15% for Minority-Owned Business Enterprises ("MBE") participation and 15% for Women-Owned Business Enterprises ("WBE") participation (based on the current availability of qualified MBEs and WBEs).
- B. Additionally, Contractor is encouraged to contact the Division of Minority and Woman Business Development ((518) 292-5250; (212) 803-2414; or (716) 846-8200) to discuss additional methods of maximizing participation by MWBEs on this Contract.

C. Where MWBE goals have been established herein, pursuant to 5 NYCRR §142.8, Contractor must document "good faith efforts" to provide meaningfu participation by MWBEs as subcontractors or suppliers in the performance of this Contract. In accordance with section 3 16-a of Article 15-A and 5 NYCRR §142.13, the Contractor acknowledges that if Contractor is fo to have willfu and intentionally fa to comply with the MWBE participation goals set fo in the Contract, such a fi constitutes a breach of Contract and the Contractor shall be liable to the Corporation fo liquidated or other appropriate damages, as set fo herein.

# III. Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO)

- A. Contractor agrees to be bound by the provisions of Article 15-A and the MWBE Regulations promulgated by the Division of Minority and Women's Business Development of the Department of Economic Development (the "Division"). If any of these terms or provisions confl with applicable law or regulations, such laws and regulations shall supersede these requirements.
- B. Contractor shall comply with the fo provisions of Article 15-A:
  - 1. Contractor and Subcontractors shall undertake or continue existing EEO programs to ensure that minority group members and women are afforded equal employment opportunities without discrimination because of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, age, disability or marital status. For these purposes, EEO shall apply in the areas of recruitment, employment, job assignment, promotion, upgrading, demotion, transfer, layoff, or termination and rates of pay or other fo of compensation.
  - 2., The Contractor shall submit an EEO policy statement (Form PROC-8) to the Corporation within seventy two (72) hours after the date of the notice by Corporation to award the Contract to the Contractor.
  - If Contractor or Subcontractor does not have an existing EEO policy statement, the Corporation may provide the Contractor or Subcontractor a model statement (see Form PROC-4 – Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprises Equal Employment Opportunity Policy Statement).
  - 4. The Contractor's EEO policy statement shall include the following language:
    - a. The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant fo employment because of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, age, disability or marital status, will undertake or continue existing EEO programs to ensure that minority group members and women are afforded equal employment opportunities without discrimination, and shall make and document its conscientious and active efforts to employ and utilize minority group members and women in its work force.
    - b. The Contractor shall state in all solicitations or advertisements fo employees that, in the perfo of the Contract, all qualifi applicants will be afforded equal employment opportunities without discrimination because of race, creed, color, national origin, sex, age, disability or marital status.
    - c. The Contractor shall request each employment agency, labor union, or authorized representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining or other agreement or understanding, to fu a written statement that such employment agency, labor union, or representative will not discriminate on the basis of race, creed, color, national

- origin, sex age, disability or marital status and that such union or representative will affi atively cooperate in the implementation of the Contractor's obligations herein.
- d. The Contractor will include the provisions of sections (a) through (c) of this subsection and paragraph "E" of this section, which provides fo relevant provisions of the Human Rights Law, in every subcontract in such a manner that the requirements of the subdivisions will be binding upon each subcontractor as to work in connection with this Contract.

## C. Form PROC-1-Staffi Plan

To ensure compliance with this section, the Contractor shall submit a staffi plan to document the composition of the proposed workfo to be utilized in the perfo of this Contract by the specifi categories listed, including ethnic background, gender, and Federal occupational categories. Contractors shall complete the Staffi plan form and submit it as part of their bid or proposal or within a reasonable time, but no later than the time of award of the Contract.

# D. . Form PROC-5 - Workfo Employment Utilization Report ("Workforce Report")

- 1. Once a Contract has been awarded and during the term of Contract, Contractor is responsible fo updating and providing notice to the Corporation of any changes to the previously submitted Staffi Plan. This info is to be submitted on a quarterly basis during the term of the Contract to report the actual workfo utilized in the performance of the Contract by the specified categories listed including ethnic background, gender, and Federal occupational categories. The Workfo Report must be submitted to report this info
  - Reports should be submitted by email to: MWBE\_EEOCreports@stormrecovery.ny.gov.
- 2. Separate forms shall be completed by Contractor and any subcontractor perfo on the Contract.
- 3. In limited instances, Contractor may not be able to separate out the workforce utilized in the performance of the Contract from Contractor's and/or subcontractor's total workforce. When a separation can be made, Contractor shall submit the Workforce Report and indicate that the info provided related to the actual workforce utilized on the subject Contract. When the workfo to be utilized on the Contract cannot be separated out fr Contractor's and/or subcontractor's total workforce, Contractor shall submit the Workforce Report and indicate that the information provided is Contractor's total workfo during the subject time frame, not limited to work specifi under the Contract.
- D. Contractor shall comply with the provisions of the Human Rights Law, all other State and Federal statutory and constitutional non-discrimination provisions. Contractor and subcontractors shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant fo employment because of race, creed (religion), color, sex, national origin, sexual orientation, military status, age, disability, predisposing genetic characteristic, marital status or domestic violence victim status, and shall also fo the requirements of the Human Rights Law with regard to non-discrimination on the basis of prior criminal conviction and prior arrest.

## IV. MWBE Utiliz

Plan

- A. The Contractor represents and warrants that Contractor has submitted an MWBE Utilization Plan (Form PROC-2) either prior to, or at the time of, the execution of this Contract.
- B. Contractor agrees to use such MWBE Utilization Plan fo the performance of MWBEs on this Contract pursuant to the prescribed MWBE goals set fo in section III-A of this Appendix II.
- C. Contractor further agrees that a fa to submit and/or use such MWBE Utilization Plan shall constitute a material breach of the terms of this Contract. Upon the occurrence of such a material breach, the Corporation shall be entitled to any remedy provided herein, including but not limited to, a finding of Contractor non-responsiveness.

#### V. Waivers

- A. For Waiver Requests Contractor should use Form PROC-3 Waiver Request.
- B. If the Contractor, aft making good fa efforts, is unable to comply with MWBE goals, the Contractor may submit a Request for Waiver documenting good faith efforts by the Contractor to meet such goals. If the documentation included with the waiver request is complete, the Corporation shall evaluate the request and issue a written notice of acceptance or denial within twenty (20) days of receipt.
- C. If the Corporation, upon review of the Utilization Plan and updated Compliance Reports determines that Contractor is fa or refusing to comply with the Contract goals and no waiver has been issued in regards to such non-compliance, the Corporation may issue a notice of defi to the Contractor. The Contractor must respond to the notice of defi within seven (7) business days of receipt. Such response may include a request fo partial or total waiver of MWBE Contract Goals.

# VI. Quarterly MWBE Contractor Compliance Report

Contractor is required to submit a Quarterly MWBE Contractor Compliance Report (Form PROC-6) to the Corporation by the 10<sup>th</sup> day following each end of quarter (i.e., March 31s<sup>t</sup>, June 30<sup>th</sup>, September 30<sup>th</sup>, and December 31s<sup>t</sup>) over the term of the Contract documenting the progress made towards achievement of the MWBE goals of the Contract. Reports should be submitted by email to: MWBE\_EEOCreports@stormrecovery.ny.gov.

# VII. Liquidated Damages - MWBE Participation

A. Where the Corporation determines that Contractor is not in compliance with the requirements of this Contract and Contractor refuses to comply with such requirements, or if Contractor is found to have willfully and intentionally fa to comply with the MWBE participation goals, Contractor shall be obligated to pay to the Corporation liquidated damages.

- B. Such liquidated damages shall be calculated as an amount equaling the difference between:
  - I. All sums identifi for payment to MWBEs had the Contractor achieved the contractual MWBE goals; and
  - 2. All sums actually paid to MWBEs fo work performed or materials supplied under the Contract.
- C. In the event a determination has been made which requires the payment of liquidated damages and such identified sums have not been withheld by the Agency, Contractor shall pay such liquidated damages to the Corporation within sixty (60) days after they are assessed by the Corporation unless prior to the expiration of such sixtieth (60<sup>th</sup>) day, the Contractor has fi a complaint with the Director of the Division of Minority and Woman Business Development pursuant to subdivision 8 of section 313 of the Executive Law in which event the liquidated damages shall be payable if Director renders a decision in fa of the Corporation.
